# Milngavie Reservoir – National garden and designed landscape – now its official

FoMR is very pleased Historic Environment Scotland (HES) completed their assessment and is going to include Milngavie Reservoir on their Inventory of gardens and designed landscape for Scotland.

HES summary of their assessment states: 'Of outstanding architectural interest for its high-quality structures, Milngavie Reservoirs is also of outstanding historic interest as

a rare example of a functional, 19<sup>th</sup> century civil engineering landscape designed and used like a public park, and which became highly valued for its 'natural beauty'. The reservoirs, associated architecture and mature planting also contribute major scenic interest to the local landscape.'

This is great news for the Reservoir community!

### Bankell pumping station and pipeline planning application update

The Council has now approved the building of a pumping station beside Bankell water holding tank. The contractor has advised work will commence on the Bankell pumping station later this year and the pipeline construction early in the new year. Work on the construction of new pipeline will impact on the reservoir and will involve the closure of Drumclog car park. More information will be forthcoming as the project progresses.
