The Friends of Milngavie Reservoir volunteers, in collaboration with Scottish Water staff, will support Volunteers' Week by holding the first joint reservoir community litter-pick today, **Friday 4 June**, to tidy up the land surrounding Mugdock and Craigmaddie Reservoirs, known collectively as the Milngavie reservoirs.

The volunteer group, which has encouraged local involvement in the event, has been instrumental in bringing together Volunteer Scotland and Keep Scotland Beautiful, as part of their community drive to enhance and protect the reservoirs.

Eddy Yacoubian, Chairman, Friends of Milngavie Reservoir, said: "We are pleased to be taking part in this joint volunteering day, to celebrate Volunteers' Week, for which we have been recognised by Keep Scotland Beautiful. I am also delighted to launch our new Vision Statement, which champions volunteering, and aims to build on a renewed sense of common purpose and community ownership, as society overcomes the pandemic. Volunteering can be a catalyst for social good and we will continue our efforts to improve the special, tranquil environment of the Milngavie reservoirs. Volunteers' Week (1-7 June) is a UK campaign, now in its 37th year, and led by a representative organisation in each of the four nations. Volunteer Scotland lead the campaign in Scotland; this year, they're encouraging everyone to take time to say 'thank you' to all volunteers.
