MILNGAVIE -- TESCO'S REDEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS

Notes from Public Meeting

Date: Thursday 14th January 2010, 7.30pm

Place: Fraser Centre, Milngavie

Present: About 100 people including MP, MSP's, Councillors, local traders and residents **Purpose of meeting**: To publicly debate Tesco's proposals for a new superstore & parking

Status: Meeting called by Eve Gilmore as part of the "We Like Milngavie" Initiative

SUMMARY NOTES FROM MEETING:

- There appeared to be <u>unanimous opposition</u> to the current proposals as per Tesco's planning application presently under consideration by the local planning authority, East Dunbartonshire Council.
- Generally most speakers were <u>opposed</u> to various aspects of the proposed development, especially excessive size, insensitive design, inappropriate materials, and adverse effect on village and local shops.
- Other specific topics of concern included :
 - 1. Potential "grid-lock" effect of increased traffic on local road network
 - 2. New building 7 metres above Woodburn Way and twice the size of existing store
 - 3. Loss of continuity of trading facility for 18 months during construction period
 - 4. Lack of provision of scale model of the proposed development
 - 5. Existing satisfactory provision of sufficient choice of non-food items
 - 6. Unattractive building for visitors entering Milngavie by car or by train
 - 7. Out-of-scale buildings adjacent to village of character and Conservation Area.
 - 8. Proposal contrary to various Policies in EDC Local Plan
 - 9. Insufficient community consultation and public awareness
 - 10. Dwarfing effect on Listed Building at Gavin's Mill
 - 11. Unproven need for larger store and increased range of goods
 - 12. Absence of Retail Impact Assessment, Environmental Report and Traffic Study
 - 13. Concerns for wildlife on adjacent Allander Water and wildlife corridor
 - 14. Damaging effect of construction traffic on local roads
 - 15. Lack of suitable links to village centre
 - 16. Range of goods to be stocked not specified
 - 17. Constant noise from plant for air conditioning and freezers.
 - 18. Light pollution from 24 hour operation of store
 - 19. Misleading and possibly inaccurate publicity material and drawings
 - 20. Prominent visibility of this large building from various aspects
 - 21. Lack of respect for local community by large commercial operator
 - 22. Lack of trust by locals of the applicant and their long term intentions
 - 22. Unattractive approach for start of West Highland Way
 - 24. Adverse combined effects of this development and the Kilmardinny scheme
 - 25. Concern about traffic issues at site entrance, and control of parking
